VAN DIEMEN'S BAND

Founded in 2016 by violinist Julia Fredersdorff, Van Diemen's Band (VDB) delivers extraordinary performances across Lutruwita/Tasmania as well as online. Varying in size from an intimate chamber group to a larger orchestra, VDB explores the creativity and expressiveness of the Baroque while also performing new works on original instruments.

Always seeking to break new ground, VDB has collaborated with guest artists such as French Baroque specialist Martin Gester, Persian/Afghani musicians Ensemble Kaboul and Tasmanian mandolin player Luke Plumb, and released a music video, *Song of the Birds*, in 2021.

VDB has performed for Ten Days on the Island, Dark Mofo and Mona Foma, toured nationally for Musica Viva Australia and internationally for Chamber Music New Zealand, and has recorded for ABC Classic and prestigious Swedish label BIS. In 2025 the artist-led recording label - VDB - launched with *Bohemia*. Future releases include *Where Everything is Music, Van Diemen's Fiddles* and an album with bass-baritone Andrew O'Connor.

VDB is an active concert presenter in Lutruwita/Tasmania, presenting Lunchbox Concerts in Nipaluna/Hobart, Launceston and Pataway/Burnie, and delivers a range of education and community engagement programs each year.

ANDREW O'CONNOR

For more than a decade Perth-born Andrew O'Connor has maintained a busy freelance career encompassing opera, the concert platform, vocal chamber music, and the classroom. Praised for his 'remarkable musicianship' (Limelight Magazine) and 'textured, fine-wine bass baritone' (Arts Hub) Andrew appears regularly with many of Australia's finest music organisations.

An established figure on the concert platform, his repertoire spans 12th Century Europe to 21st Century Australia – with noted interpretations of Schütz, Handel and the Passions of J.S. Bach and Arvo Pärt.

Professional highlights include Faure's *Requiem* with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra, Berio's *Cries of London* for the Melbourne Symphony Orchestra, Handel's *Messiah* with various orchestras, Orff's *Carmina Burana* in Canberra, appearances with the Australian Brandenburg Orchestra, Katy Abbott's *Hidden Thoughts* at the Canberra International Music Festival, and multiple touring projects for both AVÉ - Australian Vocal Ensemble and The Song Company.

ABOUT OUR INSTRUMENTS

Extraordinary music requires extraordinary instrumentalists - and instruments!

Our **harpsichord** was commissioned from Dutch maker Titus Crijnen. It was manufactured in his workshop in Sabinan (Spain) in 2022. Constructed using historically informed techniques, it is a replica of an instrument built in 1624 by the Ruckers family. The interior lid artwork was commissioned from Nipaluna/Hobart botanical artist, Deborah Wace, to reflect the unique flora of the instrument's island home.

Our **Baroque triple harp** was built in 2024 by one of the great makers of historic harps, Rainer Thurau in Germany. Made with rare flamed maple, it is a copy of one featured in a 1619 painting by Zampieri, and therefore bears that artist's name.

Our **Kirschner chamber organ** was made in Hamburg, Germany in 2011 and was our first instrument purchase in 2018. It is made using historical techniques, although an electric blower has replaced hand-pumped bellows for airflow.

All three were purchased with the generous support of over 150 individual donors - thankyou!

Julia's **piccolo violin** (nicknamed "Niccolo") was built in 2025 by Tasmanian luthier Douglas Coghill, and is on loan from a generous donor.
