ABOUT VDB

Founded in 2016 by violinist Julia Fredersdorff, Van Diemen's Band (VDB) delivers extraordinary performances across Lutruwita/Tasmania as well as online. Varying in size from an intimate chamber group to a larger orchestra, VDB explores the creativity and expressiveness of the Baroque while also performing new works on original instruments.

Always seeking to break new ground, VDB has collaborated with guest artists such as French Baroque specialist Martin Gester, Persian/Afghani musicians Ensemble Kaboul and Tasmanian mandolin player Luke Plumb, and released a music video, Song of the Birds, in 2021.

VDB has performed for Ten Days on the Island, Dark Mofo and Mona Foma, toured nationally for Musica Viva Australia and internationally for Chamber Music New Zealand, and has recorded for ABC Classic and prestigious Swedish label BIS.

VDB is an active concert presenter in Lutruwita/Tasmania, presenting Lunchbox Concerts in Nipaluna/Hobart, Launceston and Pataway/Burnie, and delivers a range of education and community engagement programs each year.

SJÓDREYGIL (SEA GHOST)

Written by VDB's 2025 Composer-in-Residence, Quin Thomson, 'Sjódreygil' is an elegy based on a Faroese myth of a sea ghost. Appearing on rocky outcrops at sea after sunset, either as a man or a dog, the creature both goads and helps the sailors it calls down.

'Sjódreygil' also draws inspiration from the aurora, which, in the words of the composer, "(spell)binds people half a world apart, and has done so since time out of mind".

In composing 'Sjódreygil', which is dedicated to the memory of PJ, Quin was influenced by the following text:

I imagine your spark of irrepressible life taking flight:

drawn home embraced, in the end by the source of all things moving living breathing loving

perhaps I will pick a star to remember you by

(constant warm anchor to aliveness Small yet impossibly large rock steady yet all too fragile

encompassing love and stubborn ungovernability our nature too alike for total comfort)

I imagine our shared energy like the aurora:

invisible forces manifest in dissonant consonant waves particles of shifting light

bridging celestial bodies mine to yours to everything
